Annual May Fun-Raiser	\$4,073	With the support received by our members and guests who attend the event, the annual fundraiser continues to be successful each year . As we have done in past years, the Sheriff's Advisory Foundation gives special thanks to Bruce Breault, Tunny Ortali and Toney Breault of McLintocks Saloon and Dining House for their many years of continuous support. Each year they have provided their services to prepare delicious meals and obtained donations from their food suppliers for the food served.
Bicycle Program	\$8,091	The annual Christmas Bicycle Give-A-Way Program continues to be a very successful community outreach program where the Sheriff's Office helps underprivileged children. Purchased miscellaneous supplies and parts to fix bikes. The final ordering of parts will enable finishing bikes for this year's giveaway program and start for next's years giveaway.Purchased 340 helmets to be given away with the bikes.
Explorer Competition	\$7,888	Three \$1,000 Scholarships for the Central Coast Law E enforcement Explorer Competition,Purchased for the Explorer Competition, \$345.00 for Ice, \$1,647.96 for food, \$2,035.73 for additional food, candy, beverages, equipment and supplies, and \$819.34 for a HP - 14" Chromebook for a competition prize.
Gang Resistance Education & Training (GREAT) Program	\$1,775	Hired Motivational Speaker.Retro Bill for a Presentation to the Boys & Girls Club of Oceano during the Summer Day Camp. The Camp consisted of approximately 100 K - 12th graders. Retro Bill provides presentations that covers Safety, Social, & Criminal Awareness for Youth, Positive Behaviors & Role-modeling.The Sheriffs Office consistently benefits from Retro Bill's education of youth by generating a positive relationship with Law Enforcement. Rented an Inflatable Obstacle Course and other Inflatable structures for use at each of last years three SLOCO Sheriff's Youth Summer Camps (total cost \$1,125.00). The camps are part of a violence prevention program taught by trained law enforcement officers. The summer camps provide fun activities and games while teaching children how to avoid taking part in bullying, violence, drugs and gangs. They encourage kids to make responsible choices in their lives.
Sheriff's Chaplain Training	\$2,863	The purpose of this course held in Modesto CA on April 16-21, 2017 is to provide a POST certified, recommended standard for Law Enforcement Chaplain Core Training for California. This course is designed to prepare prospective and incumbent Law Enforcement Chaplains (LEC) to effectively deliver services to law enforcement personnel, their organizations and the communities they serve. The primary audience for this course is clergy who have no prior chaplain or law enforcement training and have applied or are in process to become law enforcement chaplains. A secondary audience is those clergy who are functioning as Law Enforcement Chaplain but have had minimal or no formal Law Enforcement Chaplain Training.

<p>Sheriff's Citizens Mobile Application</p>	<p>\$12,075</p>	<p>Purchased a Mobile application (app) for citizens to access information about the Sheriff's Office. The app will be free to the public. The app will include a link to the SLOC Sheriff's Advisory Foundation website and other important information. The app will work with progressive organizations to develop custom iPhone and Android apps to help harness the ever increasing number of residents who have smart phone devices. The app is created to help the Sheriff's Office to better communicate with the San Luis Obispo County community. The goal is to develop a core group of technology services that allows the Sheriff's Office to create, upload and share content specific to its organization for distribution to others around our County, State and around the world.</p>
<p>Sheriff's Office Task Force (PG&amp;E Emergency Preparedness)</p>	<p>\$5,000</p>	<p>This request is to set up a rotational schedule on KSBY~ TV for the months of April and May 2017 to air six preparedness PSA's and two Crime Prevention PSA's (eight total) . Six of these Public Service Announcements were professionally produced for the Sheriff's Office and deal with the general theme of being prepared for a natural disaster. The other two were also professionally produced for Sheriff's Office and deal with general crime prevention themes. To ensure the highest visibility, the PSA's air mainly during the morning and evening newscasts on KSBY-TV.</p>
<p>Sheriff's Family Day</p>	<p>\$9,590</p>	<p>The pupose of this event is to give the residents in our community an oppourtunity to meet law enforcement and public safety personnel as they display their equipment and perform demonstrations. Annually, thousands of people attend the event which is free to people of all ages. Educational material is provided to help the public to obtain a better understanding of the law enforcement and public safety services available to them and ways to protect themselves against crime and injury. Also, it offers those who are considering public service as a career the chance to speak with other people who are already doing the job. Event expenses are for T-shirts, hot dogs, soft drinks and memorabilia given away to children under 12, and advertising, equipment rentals, and other miscellaneous items.</p>
<p>Sheriff's Office - Other Baker to Vegas Relay Race</p>	<p>\$2,000</p>	<p>This relay is the most "positive" event offered to law enforcement officers today. It promotes physical fitness which benefits performance on duty. Funding provided for four rental passenger vans, radio rentals, fuel, team t-shlrts, water and snacks for the runners and cost for each vehicle to transport participants in the Baker to Vegas Relay. The premise of the race is to build teamwork, camaraderie, promote physical fitness, and participate in good spirited competition. This is the second time time in 17 years that the Sheriff's Office has participated in this event. The relay course is 120 miles with 20 stages, over 8,000 runners, guests, family members, and support staff partiscipate in this event. Hot days and cold nights. Blood. Sweat. Pride. Honor. That's what the world's most prestigious and unique law enforcement foot race is all about.</p>
<p>SLSO-K-9 Unit</p>	<p>\$1,500</p>	<p>Three flag poles were purchased to be donated to the Sheriffs Office K-9 Unit for the K-9 Memorial. This will be a great addition to the K-9 Memorial and will be a step in the right direction to completing that project.</p>
<p>Sheriff's Mounted Posse</p>	<p>\$942</p>	<p>Purchased a solid silver &amp; gold filled award buckle, pair of silver spurs and a gift card for the outdoing Posse Captain for volunteer service. Purchased miscellneousitems for its members.</p>

Sherriff's Range	\$6,900	<p>The purpose of this request for is for Range Improvements to be able to complete the replacement of the target and medical first aid equipment shed at the Sheriffs Office live firing shooting range and to reconfigure the existing storage area to close in the left side of the existing storage building. The shed is designed to look like the other buildings currently on the site and to be weather proof. It will be used to store our paper and cardboard targets in a place not easily occupied by mice and other vermin, as well as, the first aid/trauma supplies and the AED. Currently, the targets are stored in two places, one of which is in disrepair and no longer weather proof and the small shed for the first aid supplies is in disrepair causing the supplies to be exposed to rain and insect intrusion. All work will be performed by honor farm inmates and supervision by the Range Master and the Construction Program Manager at the Honor Farm. Purchased Range poppers, target plates and dinger targets for Range improvements.</p>
Search & Rescue	\$708	<p>Purchased medical supplies and Portable Finger Oximeters to be used by the Sheriff's Search &amp; Rescue unit. Medical supplies are critical to provide life saving and support operations.</p>
Search & Rescue - Meadows	\$678	<p>Use of Christopher Meadow's funds donated to SAR to purchase rulers &amp; pencils for the Gang Resistance Education &amp; Training (GREAT) Program.</p>
Service Awards	\$4,536	<p>For year 2017, purchased and presented 67 Years of Service Pins from 5 to 35 years of service at the February 23, 2017 Sheriff's Administration Service awards Ceremony. For year 2018, purchased 72 Years of Service Pins from 5 to 30 years of service for the February 28, 2018 Sheriff's Administration Service Awards Ceremony.</p>
Women's Honor Farm	\$134	<p>Purchased quilt cotton batting for the Women's Honor Farm Sewing Program to be utilized for its ongoing sewing projects which are donated back to our community.</p>

## Local Law Enforcement Agencies

Arroyo Grande Police Department - Canine Program	\$5,000	<p>For more than 30 years the AGPD Canine Program has been credited with hundreds of felony apprehensions as well as locating firearms, missing persons and several hundred grams of narcotics. With the recent retirement of one of there canines, \$5,000 was contributed to assist in the cost of a new dog, training the dog and the officer and ongoing maintenance such as food, veterinary visits, etc. Not only are the canines valuable members to Law Enforcement Patrol staff but to our community as well, participating in events like Cops and Kids Day and numerous presentations to school and community organizations.</p>
Pismo Beach Police Department - Canine Program	\$5,000	<p>The Pismo Beach Police Department K9 Division was set to retire their current K9 Cannix. As a result, the department wanted to purchase a replacement dog to continue this most valuable program. The benefits of a Police K9 are numerous. Besides being a wonderful promotional tool for the City, our current K9, Cannix, tallied 350 drug finds, 30 demonstrations, 7 suspect locates, and 2 apprehensions in his 12,480 hours of patrol. These statistics show the value of utilizing trained Police K9s to assist operations.</p>
Cal Poly Police Department	\$2,500	<p>Hired Keith Graves, Keith Graves &amp; Associates, LLC, to conduct training in Fentanyl (opioid narcotic) Safety and other synthetic drugs which have recently showed up in San Luis Obispo County. He is a recognized expert in drug training for law enforcement. The training course was for up to 50 personel and was open to all law enforcement agencies in SLO County.</p>

## Local Law Enforcement Support Organizations

Community Emergency Response Team - Cambria (CERT)	\$4,402	<p>(1) Retro-fitted and equipped a CERT trailer provided to Estero Bay CERT by the Morro Bay Fire Department for CERT's use, including groceries for a lunch provided to volunteers who did all the work. The total project cost came in at about \$ 6,200. The Morro Bay Fire Department paid for new tires and wheels (\$850), new generator (\$1450), trailer graphics (\$750) for a total of about \$3,050.00. The project cost balance of \$3,121.85 was spent for additional CERT Trailer equipment and supplies. (2) Cost for two CERT Classe expenses, equipment &amp; supplies, one in Cambria and one in Morro Bay.</p>
